Value	Definition	% Cover

A - Abundant	Found regularly throughout a stand of a particular habitat and contributing significantly to the ground cover of that stand	30-50%
F - Frequent	Scattered plants or small clumps of plants found regularly throughout a stand (found on at least one in every three footfalls when walking through vegetation) and making a modest contribution to the ground cover of that stand	15-30%
O - Occasional	Scattered plants found on less than one in three footfalls and generally not making a contribution to the ground cover of that stand	5-15%
